MEETING MINUTES

TUESDAY, March 10, 2020 8:30 a.m.

Tippecanoe Room, Tippecanoe County Office Building 20 N 3rd Street, Lafayette, Indiana

Councilmembers present: President Kevin Underwood, Vice President John Basham, Kathy Vernon, Lisa Dullum, Ben Murray and Roland Winger.

Others present: Attorney Doug Masson, Auditor Robert A. Plantenga, and Recording Secretary John Thomas.

I. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

President Underwood called the meeting to order, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. AUDITOR'S FINANCIAL REPORT - Bob Plantenga

The 2020 financial statement shows a General Fund beginning cash balance of \$12,329,109. The projected miscellaneous revenue, property taxes and deductions for circuit breakers leaves the total funds available of \$62,084,666. When deducting encumbrances, the 2020 Budget and minimum balances established by Council, the beginning net balance is \$1,800,784. Since there were no appropriations in January, the beginning balance available for appropriations is \$1,800,784.

The Revenue Report shows the property taxes are low and will stay there until June when they come in. State and Local Public Safety (0291) is mostly the Public Defender Commission and the County has already received its quarterly payment. The Sheriff's Miscellaneous (0410) is mostly reimbursements for the Tippecanoe School Corporation for the Resource Officer. Internal Fund Transfer (0761) for \$83,333.33 are funds moved from the Health Insurance fund to support the General Fund. We only have 4.1% of our revenue received, but that will be replenished by Property Taxes.

The fund balances show: 1) the General Fund (1000) is at \$8.267 million which will trend down until June when it is replenished with property taxes. The LIT Economic Development (fund 1112) paid out the first principal payment on the Fairground Project bond. The Commissioners transferred \$100,000 into the recently established Cumulative Voting System fund (1143) to start saving for the next purchase. The County Self Insurance (fund 4710) receipts for February exceeded what was spent, so the fund continues to have a healthy balance. Lisa Dullum asked about the Jail Bond payment and the Auditor stated that this is probably the last year for the bond and is paid out of Fund 4620 and the reserve fund 4630 on January 1 and July 1.

III. TREASURER'S REPORT

The Federal Funds rate dropped a half point on March 3rd with the banks reducing their interest from 1.85% to 1.35%.

- Councilmember Murray attended the Cary Home Advisory Board and the Juvenile Alternatives Meetings and feels that juvenile services are exceptional and support kids with their needs.
- Councilmember Winger discussed the issue of the subcommittee on Public Safety and the Auditor will send out some information in preparation for a future meeting.

IX. COMMISSIONER FYI

 Commissioner Murtaugh invited everyone to a May 5th soft opening of the Fairgrounds Coliseum at 4:00; the state legislature will conclude its session on Tuesday and the Commissioners are pleased with how local government was treated, and Purdue Road School is this week.

X. PUBLIC COMMENT

- Craig Hadley, from the Tippecanoe County Historical Association, updated the Council on their recent activities and this year's plans for their five properties.
- Amber Noll, from the County Extension Office, stated that "Ag Days" were held with McCutcheon FFA
 at the County Fairgrounds February 28th, and the local office conducted a statewide Youth Mental
 Health First Aid training program.
- Sheriff Goldsmith said that while the jail study is finished, there are some safety issues that were beyond the scope of the original study that need to be addressed on the administrative side of the jail building. He would like to have DLZ come back and conduct the additional analysis. There was consensus among Councilmembers to proceed with the additional study.

XI. ADJOURNMENT

Councilmember Winger moved to adjourn, and the President adjourned the meeting.
