

TIPPECANOE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING
MAY 20, 2002

The Tippecanoe County Commissioners met on Monday, May 20, 2002 at 5:00 P.M. in the Tippecanoe Room in the County Office Building. Commissioners present were: President John L. Knochel, Vice President KD Benson, and Member Ruth E. Shedd; Auditor Robert A. Plantenga, Commissioners' Assistant Jennifer Weston, County Attorney David W. Luhman, and Secretary Pauline E. Rohr.

President Knochel called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PROPOSED 2003 SALARY INCREASES: Human Resources Director Frank Cederquist

Mr. Cederquist presented the following proposed salary increases for 2003 that include an increase in benefits and a 15% projected increase for Health Insurance. He said he based the 15% increase on the trend of claims over the last three years. This proposal does not include any new positions.

Since the Cost of Living is approximately 1.7% to 1.8%, Commissioner Knochel recommended bumping that to 2%. Mr. Cederquist said the cities' increases tend to be to the low side while Wagner, Irwin, and Scheele are seeing increases from 2.75% to 3.5%. Mr. Cederquist said the County's increases have averaged 3% over the years.

- Commissioner Benson moved to recommend a 2% salary increase for 2003 to the County Council, seconded by Commissioner Shedd.

Commissioner Benson confirmed that the Council can reduce the percent of increase at Budget time if necessary. She said she would hate to go below the Cost of Living but she knows funding will be tight.

RESOLUTION 2002-20-CM: Amend 34 to EDIT Plan

Attorney Luhman explained that this Resolution adds Project 36, funding for the CDC (Community Development Corporation). He noted the CDC requested \$100,000 per year for three (3) years. The Resolution expands the definition of Project 20 to Planning, Design, Engineering, Construction and Reconstruction of General Drain Improvements including Regional Drainage Facilities. It also identifies six (6) Regional Drainage Facilities.

**RESOLUTION MODIFYING THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN OF THE TIPPECANOE COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCOME TAX:
ADDING PROJECT 36 FUNDING FOR GREATER LAFAYETTE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, AND AMENDING AND PROVIDING ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR PROJECT 20 GENERAL DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS**

AMENDMENT 34

WHEREAS, authority has been granted by IC 6-3.5-7-15 to The Board of Commissioners of the County of Tippecanoe, to adopt a Capital Improvement Plan for the County of Tippecanoe setting forth the uses of the revenues which Tippecanoe County shall receive from the Economic Development Income Tax duly adopted in the year 1989; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners of the County of Tippecanoe adopted Resolution 90-03-CM establishing an Economic Development Income Tax Capital Improvement Plan on the 7th day of May, 1990 and said Capital Improvement Plan was amended on the 11th day of June, 1990, pursuant to Resolution 90-07 CM; subsequently amended on August 5, 1991, pursuant to Resolution 91-12-CM and again amended on November 9, 1994, pursuant to Resolution 94-14-CM, and again amended on April 1, 1996, pursuant to Resolution No. 96-05-CM, again amended on July 26, 1996, pursuant to Resolution No. 96-09-CM, again amended on February 3, 1997, pursuant to Resolution No. 97-6; and again amended on March 31, 1997, pursuant to Resolution No. 97-19-CM; and again amended on January 20, 1998, pursuant to Resolution No. 98-08-CM; and again amended on May 4, 1998 pursuant to Resolution No. 98-22-CM; and modified and ratified on May 18, 1998 pursuant to Resolution No. 98-26-CM; and again amended on July 20, 1998 pursuant to Resolution No. 98-34-CM; and again amended October 5, 1998 pursuant to Resolution No. 98-42-CM, and again amended on November 2, 1998, pursuant to Resolution No. 98-46-CM, and again amended on March 1, 1999 pursuant to Resolution No. 99-13-CM, and again amended on April 8, 1999 pursuant to Resolution No. 99-19-CM as Modified and Ratified on April 19, 1999 pursuant to Resolution No. 99-22-CM; and again amended on May 3rd, 1999, pursuant to Resolution No. 99-18-CM; and again amended on October 4, 1999, pursuant to Resolution No. 99-30-CM; and again amended on February 7, 2000, pursuant to Resolution 2000-08-CM; and again amended on April 3, 2000, pursuant to Resolution 2000-16-CM as Modified and Ratified on April 17, 2000 pursuant to Resolution No. 2000-22-CM; and again amended on May 3, 2000 pursuant to Resolution 2000-25-CM; and again amended on June 5, 2000 pursuant to Resolution No. 2000-29-CM; and again amended and re-adopted as amended on February 20, 2001 pursuant to Resolution 2001-06-CM; and again amended and re-adopted as amended on April 2, 2001 pursuant to Resolution 2001-15-CM; and again amended and re-adopted as amended on July 16, 2001 pursuant to resolution 2001-32-CM; and again amended and readopted as amended on September 5, 2001 pursuant to Resolution 2001-41-CM; and again amended and readopted as amended on November 7, 2001 pursuant to Resolution 2001-48-CM; and again amended and readopted as amended on December 3, 2001 pursuant to Resolution 2001-52-CM; and again amended and readopted as amended on March 18, 2002 pursuant to Resolution 2002-06-CM;

WHEREAS, said Capital Improvement Plan has, from time to time, been modified, as set forth above, consistent with the Capital Improvement needs of Tippecanoe County; and

WHEREAS, IC 6-3.5-7-13.1(b)(2)(B) authorizes the use of Economic Development Income Tax revenues for non-profit corporations whose primary corporate purpose is to assist government in planning and implementing economic development projects; and

WHEREAS, Greater Lafayette Community Development Corporation (GLCDC) is an Indiana not-for-profit corporation organized for the purpose of supporting and enhancing the long-term health of Greater Lafayette through development of land and property for the enhancement of social, cultural, economic welfare, charitable and educational purposes that serve the common good, improvement of the overall quality of life for Greater Lafayette residents, community development, and the creation of jobs, particularly for those of low and moderate income;

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Tippecanoe County has determined that the economic support of the GLCDC would be of economic utility and benefit to the County of Tippecanoe and that the Capital Improvement Plan should be amended to add thereto Project No. 36, Funding for Greater Lafayette Community Development Corporation in the amount of \$ _____ per year for a period of _____ years, commencing with fiscal year 2002; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners desires to amend Project 20, General Drainage Improvements to provide funding for planning, design and engineering as well as construction and reconstruction and provide additional funding therefor, in the amount of \$1,000,000 in year 2002; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Tippecanoe desires to re-adopt the Capital Improvement Plan, as amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that after due consideration, The Board of Commissioners of the County of Tippecanoe hereby confirms its finding that the provision of funding for the Greater Lafayette Community Development Corporation (GLCDC) in the amount of \$ _____ per year for a period of _____ years commencing with fiscal year 2002, be and the same is hereby approved and identified as a project for which economic development income tax revenues may be used pursuant to IC 6-3.5-7-13.1, and that the following amendment to the Capital Improvement Plan should be adopted:

There is added to the Capital Improvement Plan Project Thirty Six (36).

**PROJECT THIRTY-SIX
FUNDING FOR GREATER LAFAYETTE
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION**

Identification and General Description of Project:

Funding will be provided to GLCDC for a period of _____ years to assist GLCDC in fulfilling its purpose of supporting and enhancing the long-term health of Greater Lafayette through development of land and property for the enhancement of social, cultural, economic welfare, charitable and educational purposes that serve the common good, improvement of the overall quality of life for Greater Lafayette residents, community development, and the creation of jobs, particularly for those of low and moderate income.

Estimated Total Project Cost:

\$ _____ per year for a period of ___ years, for a total cost of \$ _____.

Identification of All Sources of Funds for Project:

Tippecanoe County will grant a maximum of \$ _____ to the project from EDIT revenues, with the remainder of the funding being from charitable contributions from individuals, corporations, business organizations and governmental institutions.

Use of Funds from Tippecanoe County:

A maximum of \$ _____ of EDIT funds from Tippecanoe County will be used.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Project Twenty (20) of the Capital Improvement Plan should be amended to read as follows:

**PROJECT NUMBER TWENTY (20)
PLANNING, DESIGN, ENGINEERING, CONSTRUCTION AND RECONSTRUCTION OF
GENERAL DRAIN IMPROVEMENTS**

Section 1. The Tippecanoe County Commissioners find that Project Number Twenty (20), the Planning, Design, Engineering, Construction and Reconstruction of General Drain Improvements, including regulated drains and regional drainage facilities will (a) promote significant opportunities for the gainful employment of citizens; (b) attract major new businesses and enterprises to Tippecanoe County; and c) will retain or expand significant businesses and enterprises within Tippecanoe County.

Section 2. The expenditure of these funds involve an expenditure for infrastructure improvements.

Section 3. Tippecanoe County, consistent with its desire to improve the general drainage of lands within the county for the purpose of promoting economic development, modifies the Capital Improvement Plan by adding the following costs and funding:

**Planning, Design, Engineering, Construction and Reconstruction
of General Drain Improvements, including Regional Drainage Facilities**

including the improvements of general drainage within the county including without limitation thereby regulated drains and regional drainage facilities, in accordance with the priorities established by the Tippecanoe County Drainage Board and the Tippecanoe County Surveyor in consideration of their potential for the improvement of the future economic development of the County, and as to be supplemented by other available funds, the sum of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) from Economic Development Income Tax funds in fiscal year 2002 and to be further supplemented by general drain improvement funds and other funds as may become available, all in compliance with the laws of the State of Indiana.

Section 4. This plan is to extend into such years as necessary as to insure completion as funding is available from the economic development income tax, or other funds, and in compliance with all laws.

Section 5. The planning and development stage, and the construction stage, are to be completed as funds are available as set forth above.

Section 6. The specific projects set forth in and attached to this Resolution are incorporated herein.

Section 7. That said list of projects identifies and generally describes each project that will be funded by the Economic Development Income Tax, gives the estimated cost of the project, and identifies all sources of funds expected to be used for each project.

Section 8. Each of the projects set forth in said list of projects is to be scheduled so that planning, engineering, design, development and construction will be completed in 2002 or as soon thereafter as is reasonably practicable.

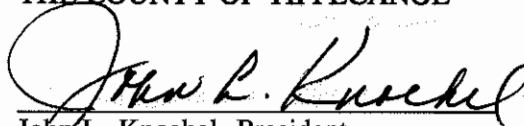
