

**TIPPECANOE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING  
COUNTY OFFICE BUILDING – TIPPECANOE ROOM  
TUESDAY, APRIL 11, 2017  
8:30 A.M.**

The Tippecanoe County Council met Tuesday, April 11, 2017 in the Tippecanoe Room of the County Office Building at 8:30 a.m. Councilmembers present were President John Basham, Vice President Bryan Metzger, Roland Winger, Kevin Underwood, David R Williams, and Vicki Burch. Others present were Auditor Robert A. Plantenga, Attorney Doug Masson, and Recording Secretary Caitlin Thomas. Councilmember Kathy Vernon was absent.

**Pledge of Allegiance**

President Basham called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Auditor's Financial**

Auditor Plantenga stated the county began 2017 with a General Fund cash balance of \$8,632,700.77. With projected misc. revenue, projected transfer from COIT fund, property taxes, and deducting circuit breaker credits the total available is \$53,404,949.77. The beginning net balance is \$1,321,654.77. We have approved additional appropriations of \$45,765 so far this year. There are reductions of \$6,299. Our uncommitted funds balance is \$1,281,738.77. We have \$867 of request for this meeting. The COIT fund balance is still \$668,516.29.

He said there are no property taxes transferred to the General Fund this month. We should be at around 25% of revenue for the year if all revenue was uniformly received. General Fund cash balance at the end of March was \$1,676,000. We start trending down around this time of year and it will go back up with settlement. Fund 2580, Court Services substance abuse, is the active fund with a balance of \$16,675. This will probably transfer into the court services fund. Fund 2580 did gain about \$4,000. Fund 2585 is at \$19,000 and \$4,000 has been appropriated. Fund 4710, Health Insurance, is now up to \$1.8 million balance and we have \$3 million in the Health Insurance Rainy Day fund. Councilmember Winger asked about the transfer for the court services fund 2581 that took place in January and the receipts that are still coming in. He suggested we get a timeline for when the receipts will taper off and we can take care of the transfer. Auditor Plantenga said if we transfer it all back to Rainy Day it does not leave a very big cushion in 2581, but we could pay part of it back.

**Treasurer's Report**

Treasurer Weston stated the interest rates increased another .25% in mid-March. 1<sup>st</sup> Source and Lafayette Bank and Trust have already adopted the new rates. Centier is not directly tied to the fed funds, but will also increase the rate. The March average was .98% and the weighted average was .96%. March and April are not our biggest month to receive interest for the long term investments so there was not as much received from those. The total interest received was \$63,432.60. With the increase, we will see the projected balance for the general fund continue to change. She stated if the rates continue to go up, she will just give a new projected balance at budget time.

Tax bills were sent out last Tuesday and we have collected about 2% of the total billed. There were 66,013 total bills, which equated to about 45,000 pieces of mail and \$178 million dollars billed.

**Committee Reports**

Councilmember Williams requested transfers received after the deadline be moved to the next month's agenda unless it is an emergency. Auditor Plantenga requested if there was an emergency request, the department contact their Council representatives and possibly bring it up under other business rather than the consent agenda. Councilmember Williams stated the emergency should be determined by the Auditor's office, and it would be fine to involve the Council representatives.

- Councilmember Williams moved to have transfers received late be moved to the next month's agenda unless it is an agenda, second by Councilmember Winger. Motion carried.

**Unfinished/New Business**

**Commissioner FYI**

Commissioner Murtaugh requested the Councilmembers contact their state representatives regarding the Senate transportation bill. They are working out a compromise between a House bill and the current Senate version. The bill changes the formula for MVH and LRS and virtually all of the highway department salaries are paid out of MVH. The bill would possibly limit the things you can pay out of MVH fund to possibly not include salaries and that would mean the salaries would have to be paid out of the General Fund.

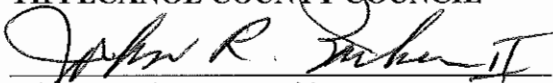

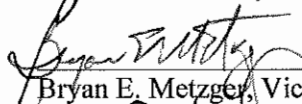
**Public Comment**

Councilmember Burch moved to adjourn, second by Councilmember Metzger. President Basham adjourned the meeting at 8:58 am.

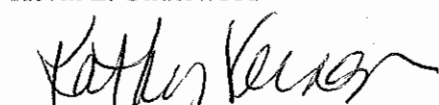

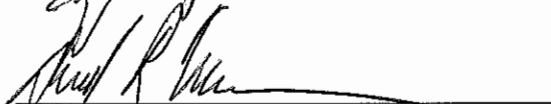

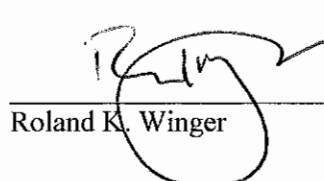
