

**TIPPECANOE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING
COUNTY OFFICE BUILDING – TIPPECANOE ROOM
MONDAY, NOVEMBER 07, 2016
8:30 A.M.**

The Tippecanoe County Council met Monday, November 7, 2016 in the Tippecanoe Room of the County Office Building at 8:30 a.m. Council member present were President David R Williams, Vice President John Basham, Kevin Underwood, Kathy Vernon, Bryan Metzger, Sally Siegrist, and Roland Winger. Others present were Auditor Robert A. Plantenga, Attorney Doug Masson, and Assistant Caitlin Thomas.

Pledge of Allegiance

President Williams called the meeting to order and led the pledge of allegiance.

Auditor's Financial Report

Auditor Plantenga reported on the September Financial Statement stating the beginning Cash Balance in the General Fund was \$9,145,040.42. With the 2016 Miscellaneous Revenue and Property Tax, with the deduction for circuit breakers, the Total Available was \$41,110,444.42. Deducting the Encumbrances, the 2016 Budget, the Minimum Balance, the beginning balance was \$517,912.42. Additional Appropriations to date, and the Miscellaneous Expenditures of \$479,830.00; the Total currently available is \$44,357.00. Auditor Plantenga noted two departments basically trading appropriations with an appropriation and reduction that would mean a Net General Fund additional appropriation request of \$14,000.00. The COIT Fund began with a Cash Balance of \$2,262,873.18. Adding the COIT Revenue and deducting the Encumbrances, the Beginning Net Balance was \$360,171.18. With \$40,136 of COIT appropriations this year, the current balance available is \$320,035.18. Auditor noted 0411 Sheriff Inmate Housing received at the end of October the July '16 from the DOC and is now over 100% projected for the year.

Auditor reported a 1.35 million balance in the general fund. The Rainy Day fund (1186) still has the same balance. An appropriation for part of the payoff of the parking garage bond will be approved at commissioners meeting. We will be putting in just as much as we are taking out for the parking garage fund. Fund 1205, the tax sales surplus, has a \$1.1 million dollar balance. In funds, 2580 and 2581 (Court Services) hold about \$70,000 combined balance. Self-insurance fund 4710 has a balance of \$1.336 million. Auditor Plantenga noted that this fund began the year with \$300,000, so we have made good progress.

Commissioner FYI

Commissioner Byers notified the council that at the Nov 21st meeting Commissioner meeting there will be a public hearing on the syringe exchange program. He also asked if there were any objections about talking to the YMCA about buying property. Councilmember Siegrist asked what was planned for the 10 acres of property. Commissioner Byers advised it would add ground to fairgrounds, moving extension property, and possibly health department to make a central location. They would use the existing building in plan and is also frees up space here in downtown location. County owns egress. Councilmember Winger asked for more detailed plan, alternative, and true operational increases. Councilmembers gave consensus to prepare resolution for the YMCA to allow commissioners to pursue the negotiations.

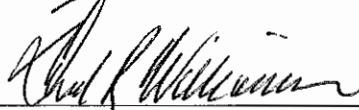
Commissioner Murtaugh advised we are in last week of United Way campaign and asked council to pledge gifts.

President Williams adjourned the meeting at 9:51 a.m.

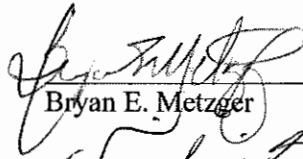

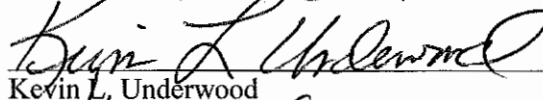

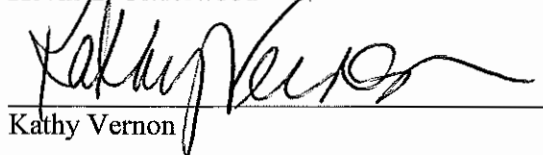
