

TIPPECANOE COUNTY COUNCIL
REGULAR MEETING
July 8, 2008

The Tippecanoe County Council met at 2:00 p.m. Tuesday, July 8, 2008 in the Tippecanoe Room in the County Office Building. Council members present were: President Thomas P. Murtaugh, Vice President Kevin Underwood, Jeffrey A. Kemper, Betty J. Michael, Kathy Vernon, David S. Byers, and Andrew S. Gutwein. Others present were: Auditor Jennifer Weston, Attorney David W. Luhman, and Secretary Jennifer Prange.

President Murtaugh called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- Councilmember Kemper moved to approve minutes from the June 10, 2008 meeting, second by Councilmember Michael; motion carried.

Auditor Weston stated today's request for consideration are for \$79,250 and reductions of \$67,250 mostly from funds transferring from Township Assessors to the County Assessor.

TREASURER – Robert Plantenga

Treasurer Plantenga reported the average interest rate is down to 2% for May. He reported 14 Certificates of Deposit were purchased from 6 different banks in the community with an interest rate as high as 3.85%. With a change in collection agencies, personal property collections have increased substantially.

VETERANS SERVICES – Randy Fairchild & John Knochel

Commissioner John Knochel spoke regarding a new vehicle for Veterans Services. He reported Director Randy Fairchild has requested assistance from the commissioners regarding a new van for transporting veterans to area hospitals. The government has established new guidelines on the amount of mileage a transport vehicle can reach. Director Fairchild confirmed the Disabled Veteran's Chapter in Tippecanoe County has raised approximately \$6,000 to assist in purchase of a new van estimated to cost approximately \$15,000. He will only spend the difference between cost and what is raised by the DAV.

EDIT Plan Update

Resolution 2008-25-CL; Amending EDIT Plan Project #59

Attorney Dave Luhman gave details of Resolution 2008-25-CL. The resolution details Project #59; Project Safety Network which links all public safety agencies into one centralized computer system divided into two parts with one server for critical function and a backup server for other functions.

YOUTH SERVICES UPDATE – Rebecca Humphrey

Director Humphrey reported the council will hold a public meeting on July 15, 2008 at 7:00 p.m. in the Tippecanoe Room to discuss the Juvenile Justice Center. Councilmember Vernon requested Director Humphrey prepare a report detailing the cost to the community to have the Juvenile Justice Center and the cost to the community if the center is not built.
